Because you live here, you are part of the history of the great state of Maryland. He gave guided tours of Baltimore Washington Airport, attending the ceremony naming it for Supreme Court Justice Thurgood Marshall, which researched the artist who sculpted the statue portraying Justice Marshall, Antonio Tobias Mendez.

## **Homeowner Property Tax Credit**

Residents 65 and older who have owned their homes for at least 10 years, are eligible for a 5-year, 20% Property Tax Credit. The limit on the property's value is \$500,000, indexed upward annually by 3% for normal inflation. The Property Tax Credit will remain in place for a period of up to five years. Apply online at:

## In Memoriam, Lynn Distelhorst Getz

A dear neighbor, Lynn Getz, has passed. Born April 10, 1945 in Bronxville, NY to parents Carl and Josephine Smith Distelhorst, she was baptized in Highland Park, Illinois in October of 1951.

She grew up to be a tall, willowy blonde, traveling abroad, and even meeting President John F.
Kennedy. She met and married her husband, Stan
Eagle Getz, on October 21, 1979, in Washington, D.C.

Since 1978, the Getz couple owned a house here, but it wasn't their primary residence. Despite that, they stayed connected to the community, and often participated in civic matters. Lynn was a great researcher, always finding news articles or issues that might affect the neighborhood. She read the newsletter every month and sent news bits to add information to be shared with neighbors. When the trees on her property had numerous dead limbs and were threatening neighbors' and her own house, she deliberately sought out another neighbor, Saturnino Reyes, to perform the work of removing the trees and bushes and improving the property's safety. Not only did she pay him for his work, but she bought a wood chipper to use for his business.

Lynn was a kind and intelligent person who graced our community with her attendance at meetings, support for civic issues, and personal acts of thoughtfulness and generosity. We join her daughter Kiya in honoring her life and acknowledging her contributions to our community.
